Deadline Extended to February 20, 2008.

Deep Springs College has extended the application period for the **Herb Reich Early-Career Teaching Fellowship in the Natural Sciences** for the 2008-2009 academic year.

This fellowship offers a mentored teaching experience in a selective liberal arts environment. The Reich Fellow will teach self-designed courses within the area of his or her expertise, as well as introductory courses. Fellows learn to consider and convey their discipline within the broader context of a liberal education. The teaching load is 3 courses per year, distributed 1-2 or 2-1. The one-year fellowship is renewable up to three years.

About Deep Springs

Located in an isolated desert valley, Deep Springs is the smallest and most selective college in the country. Its twenty-six students receive a full scholarship for room, board, and tuition. The college aims to prepare students for a life of service to humanity through a rigorous liberal arts curriculum, student body self-governance, and ranch labor. After two years at Deep Springs, students typically transfer to schools such as Harvard, Oxford, and the University of Chicago.

Teaching at Deep Springs

Professors at Deep Springs live on campus in faculty houses and work closely with students both inside and outside the classroom. The student-to-faculty ratio is about five to one; most classes have fewer than six students.
